NOTICE OF RACE

1. LOCATION University of South Florida Haney Landing Sailing Center, St. Petersburg Campus, next to the FL Marine Research Institute, 1st street and 7th Avenue SE. Please do not park in the Florida Marine Research Institute lot. You may park on the street (Refer to: <http://www1.stpt.usf.edu/aboutusf/map>). Metered spots on the street are \$.75 per hour, but have a 3-hour limit. Weekend parking in the USF lot one block east of the Sailing Center is generally not patrolled.

2. CLASSES Twenty FJs and operating equipment will be provided. FJs will be rotated (conditions permitting) among competitors to assure equality of equipment. Personal safety equipment including US Coast Guard Type III PFDs and other gear (e.g., cold weather) must be furnished by the competitors. Bailers will not be provided.

3. ELIGIBILITY All new 2011-12 Member Schools of the South Atlantic Interscholastic Sailing Association (SAISA) and those that have not qualified for the Mallory or Baker Regatta in the last 4 years, 8th grade and up... *OR Any School New to SAISA is ELIGIBLE!*

The following school teams are not eligible due to qualification in the ISSA Mallory or Baker Regattas in the March-Q series:

Antilles School (08/09/10/11), H. B. Plant HS (08/09/10/11), Lakewood HS (08), Martin County HS (09), James Island Charter (08), Sarasota HS (08/09/10/11), St. Thomas Aquinas HS (08/10/11).

Competitors on a team must attend the same high school they represent full time and must be in the 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade as of the date of the Regatta. *Two or more sailors from the same school will make up the team.*

Registration for the event should be received by SAISA no later than Tuesday, Sep. 27th.

Registration is on a first paid/first allowed basis. Registration will be limited to 32 school teams, one team per school. If a team is accepted to the regatta and cannot attend, please notify regatta organizer as soon as possible so that teams on the waiting list can be invited. Teams that cancel after Tuesday, September 27 or are a no-show shall forfeit their registration fee.

The regatta will serve as both the District Great Oaks Championship & qualification for the National ISSA Great Oaks Invitational Regatta in New Orleans Nov. 18-20, 2011. All teams must be registered with entry fees paid by COB Tuesday, 27 September. There will be no late registration at the USF regatta site. (Note that if qualifying, the school team for the ISSA National Invitational event will be composed of 2 and a maximum of 4 sailors.)

A responsible adult is required to accompany each team and be responsible for the school's team including their conduct on and off the water. The responsible adult is expected to have full authority to obtain medical treatment for his/her team members.

4. ENTRY FEE & DAMAGE DEPOSIT There will be an entry fee of \$40.00, plus a boat damage deposit of \$100.00.

NOTE: All participating school teams must pre-register for this event.

Damage deposits: Each team is expected to accept full financial responsibility if they cause damage or loss to the boats and equipment used in this regatta. Damage that requires more than normal maintenance is considered a serious incident. If the jury determines that reasonable care was not used and resulted in damage, one or both boats may be held financially responsible and/or disqualified regardless of any alternative penalties already taken. If the jury is unable to assess a particular team, deposits will be pooled and used to pay for damage and loss. The findings will be final and not subject to appeal in this regard. *Unused deposits will be voided within 3 weeks of the last race.*

6. AWARDS & QUALIFICATION FOR NATIONAL EVENT Trophies will be awarded to the top qualifying school teams. It is expected that 6-7 double-handed teams from within the South Atlantic District will be eligible to participate in the ISSA Great Oaks Invitational Regatta.

Written invitations will be given to all qualifying school teams to attend the event in New Orleans with a time limit for RSVP. Failure to respond will result in the alternate team securing the berth. Additionally, positive responses followed by withdraw after the time limit expires will place the team at the bottom of the queue the following year. Following qualification, if notification is not received on or before **21 October** by SAISA that the qualifying team can attend the ISSA Great Oaks event, an alternate team will be invited.

Following notification to SAISA, the qualifying teams must then submit check and all forms to the G. O. Registrar in New Orleans or the berth will be lost to another district.

7. AUTHORITY This regatta will be governed by the current ISSA Procedural Rules and the SAISA Supplementary Rules, *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the prescriptions of US SAILING, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions. Advertising will be restricted to Category A. An official bulletin board will be maintained at the sailing center for changes to this notice, the race instructions, etc. It is the skipper's responsibility to check the board for changes.

8. FORMAT This will be a one-division regatta with single A-division sailing – *minimum 2 sailors per school form a team*; teams will rotate through the boats (other sailors may be substituted at this time) per a rotation posted on the day of the event. The number of races in a series will be equal to the number of teams competing in the regatta. Time permitting; the Race Committee will attempt to run a multiple series of races. All races will be scored regardless of whether the series was completed. Three races will constitute a regatta. All coaching, including instruction, assistance, equipment or sustenance shall be provided only on

shore or on a designated vessel on the water. Competitors should expect numerous short races with boat rotations as set forth at the skipper's meeting. Two or more sailors will compose the school's team.

9. SCORING Low point system for individual races as modified by ISSA Rule 9. Ties will be resolved per procedural rule 11(c).

10. LUNCH No lunches, food, or drinks will be provided. Plan to be on the water all day so bring plenty of food and a RE-USABLE container for water with you in the morning. Use of disposable plastic water bottles is HIGHLY DISCOURAGED. Large Igloo containers of ice water will be available to all competitors, coaches, and spectators for refilling your re-usable canister (e.g. Nalgene).

Announcement:

No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, or distilled spirits, each as defined in Chap 51 of the US Internal Revenue Code and intended for beverage use), or marijuana, cocaine, or any other controlled substance (as defined in 21 US Code 802), the possession of which, by that contestant is unlawful under 21 US Code 841. Infringements of this regulation and/or other discipline expectations occurring during this event may be the basis for a hearing under RRS 69.1. The protest committee for such a hearing shall be the regatta chairperson, a member of the ISSA BOD, and the protest committee chairperson. This protest committee shall, at a time and place selected by them, meet to hear said protest, and their decision to impose scoring penalties, or other sanctions they alone deem appropriate, including summary removal from the regatta, shall be final, without appeal.
