

**NOTICE OF RACE
INLAND NORTH POINTS 2 SAISA REGATTA
OCTOBER 21-22, 2006**

**HOST: CONCORD SAILING CENTER
SITE: CONCORD YACHT CLUB; KNOXVILLE, TN**

1. RULES

This regatta will be governed by the current ISSA Procedural Rules, SAISA Supplemental Rules, *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the prescriptions of US Sailing, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions.

2. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Saturday October 21

08:30 Arrival and check-in, boat rigging

09:00 Competitors' Meeting

10:00 Start of first race of day

Sunday October 22 (if necessary to complete fair rotation):

09:00 Start of next race in continuation from Saturday

12:00 Latest start time of a race

3. FORMAT

This will be a two-division regatta; teams will rotate through the boats per a rotation posted on the day of the event. Competitors should expect numerous short races with boat rotations as set forth at the skipper's meeting. It will be the goal of the race committee to complete one full round robin rotation of boats. Schools should be prepared to race on Sunday. Three races in each division must be completed to constitute a regatta. All coaching, including instruction, assistance, equipment or sustenance shall be on shore.

4. SCORING

Low point system for individual races as modified by ISSA Rule 9. Ties will be resolved per procedural rule 11(c). Note that when the school "team" is composed of 2 or more sailors from different schools the composite team sailor's schools will be indicated on the results. Minimally the 1st-3rd divisional & top 3 places will indicate the names of the sailors & crews on the race results. Race highlights with results will be forwarded within 3 days to SAISA for processing & points will be awarded to qualify for participation in SAISA North's Gold or Silver Regattas. The top six teams in the Gold Regatta will gain berths in the District Championship & qualifier for the ISSA Mallory Trophy regatta.

5. AWARDS & TROPHIES

Prizes will be awarded as soon as possible after the last race to be sailed in the event.

6. FEES

The entry fee shall be \$35.00 per school team, paid in advance by using the Regatta [Registration](#) and [Waiver](#) forms available on the South Atlantic Interscholastic Sailing Association website (www.saisa.org) under "General Forms - [Samples](#)". Checks, registration form, waivers, and the number of lunches needed should be mailed to: Wayne Cutler, 7901 High Heath, Knoxville, TN 37919 by [Wednesday midnight, October 18th](#). Make checks payable to Concord Sailing Center.

7. ELIGIBILITY

Schools in the North division of SAISA (Jacksonville northward) who are paid members of ISSA. If a school wishes to participate, and has not yet paid the ISSA/SAISA dues, they will be provided the opportunity to pay dues at check-in. Registrations for the event should be received by the event chairman no later than [Wednesday midnight, October 18th](#). Registration is on a first paid/first allowed basis. Once 10 schools have registered, each school after the 10th will be notified that their entry shall be contingent upon their ability to bring their own JY15 sailboat to add to the rotation.

Points will be awarded to qualify for participation in SAISA North's Gold or Silver Regattas. The top six teams in the Gold Regatta will advance to the District Elimination for the Mallory Trophy, within the South Atlantic District. All schools must be members in good standing with SAISA.

Competitors must attend the school they represent full time and must be in the 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade, as of the date of the Regatta. If your school does not have sufficient sailors to form the necessary teams, we will attempt to "mix and match" sailors from different member schools. An adult team representative is required to accompany each team and be responsible for their conduct on and off the water. The team representative, who may be an advisor, coach, or parent, is expected to have full authority to obtain medical treatment for his/her team members.

Eligible SAISA schools may enter both varsity and JV teams, however only the varsity team score will be used to determine Championship Points. A JV team from eligible schools may also be entered only when pre-approved by SAISA. For JV team approval, contact Tom Monkus at tmonkus@saisa.org. Depending upon boat availability, JV teams and single-division teams may be assigned to sail non-rotating 420s.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available upon check-in at CYC.

9. BOATS

JY15s will be used, and Concord Sailing Center will provide 10 boats. Personal safety equipment including US Guard Type III PFDs must be furnished by the competitors. The JY15s are self-bailing.

10. RACING AREA

The racing will be on Fort Loudon Lake out of Concord Yacht Club.

11. DAMAGE

Damage that requires more than normal maintenance is considered a serious incident. If the Protest Committee determines that reasonable care was not used and resulted in damage one or both boats may be disqualified regardless of any alternative penalties already taken. In extreme cases, either or both boats may be excluded from the rest of the regatta and held financially responsible for the damages.

12. FOOD

Lunches will be available Saturday for \$4.50. Reservations for lunches should be sent in with registration to guarantee availability. Water will be provided.

13. DIRECTIONS

Concord Yacht Club is located west of Knoxville, TN, and south of I-40/75.

Going west from Knoxville on I-40/75 take exit 374 (Lovell Road). Go south on Lovell Road to Kingston Pike. Turn right and go west on Kingston Pike to Concord Road. Turn left and go 1.8 mi. south on Concord Road. At dead end, turn right onto Northshore Drive. Go 1.0 mi. and turn left into CYC entrance at 11600 Northshore Drive.

Going east toward Knoxville on I-40/75 take exit 373 (Campbell Station Road). Go south on Campbell Station Road until it merges with Concord Road. At dead end of Concord Road, turn right onto Northshore Drive. Go 1.0 mi. and turn left into CYC entrance at 11600 Northshore Drive.

14. CAMPING/HOUSING

The Club has great camping/bathing facilities. Also teams may wish to bunk in the Clubhouse; bring air mattresses and sleeping bags. Please advise Wayne Cutler (cell 865-386-5485) if you plan to spend the night at CYC and give him the approximate time of your arrival.

WARNING: The University of Tennessee plays Alabama on October 21st, and motel space will be very scarce. Register early!

There are 10 rooms available at the Days Inn at exit 374, phone 865-966-5801 (\$89 plus tax for two double beds); ask for "CYC Reservation" and put the room reservation in your name and on your credit card. Days Inn will cancel all rooms not taken by October 6th.
