

SAISA INLAND NORTH POINTS REGATTA 2

NOTICE OF RACE

October, 1-2 2011 – Lake Norman Yacht Club
HOST HIGH SCHOOL: LAKE NORMAN HIGH SCHOOL

1. RULES

This regatta will be governed by the current ISSA Procedural Rules, SAISA Supplemental Rules, *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the prescriptions of US Sailing, this Notice of Race (except as changed by the Sailing Instructions), and the Sailing Instructions.

2. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Saturday

0800 Arrival, check-in at Pavilion and boat rigging

0830 Competitor's Meeting

0900 First Warning Signal

Sunday

0900 First Warning Signal (only if racing is necessary to constitute a "fair" regatta)

1400 Latest Warning Signal

3. FORMAT

This will be a two-division regatta; teams will rotate through the boat per a rotation distributed on the day of the event. Competitors should expect numerous short races. It will be the goal of the race committee to complete one full rotation. Three races in each division must be completed to constitute a regatta. All coaching, including instruction, assistance, equipment or sustenance shall be provided on shore.

4. SCORING

4.1 Low point system for individual races as modified by ISSA Rule 9. Ties will be resolved per procedural rule 11 (c). Note that when the school "team" is composed of 2 or more sailors from different schools, the composite team sailor's schools will be indicated on the results. Race highlights with results will be forwarded to SAISA for processing & points will be awarded to qualify for participation in the North Points "Gold" regatta to determine qualifying teams for the SAISA District Championship.

4.2 Protest hearings, if any, may take place between races. We will attempt to post preliminary results in real time between races.

5. AWARDS & TROPHIES

Prizes will be awarded as soon as possible after the last race sailed in the event.

6. ELIGIBILITY

6.1 All **2011-12 member** schools of SAISA are eligible. Other SAISA teams may participate depending upon boat availability. All teams must be members in good standing with SAISA.

6.2 If a school wishes to participate, and has not yet paid ISSA/SAISA dues, they will be provided the opportunity to pay dues at check-in.

6.3 Registration will be accepted first from Inland Area teams whose registration package is received by Monday, 09/26/11. Registration from other areas will then be accepted - **All registrations are to be received by Lisa Chambers no later than Tuesday, 9/27/11.** Registration is on a first paid/first allowed.

6.4 Competitors must attend the school they represent full time and must be in the 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade, as of the date of the Regatta.

6.5 An adult school representative/advisor is required to accompany each team and be responsible for the conduct on and off the water. The team representative, who may be an advisor, coach, or parent, is expected to have full authority to obtain medical treatment for his team members.

6.6 Depending on boat availability, eligible SAISA teams may enter both varsity and JV sailors (if the team membership is at 12 or more sailors); however only the varsity team score will be used to determine Championship Points. A JV team may also be entered only when pre-approved by SAISA. For JV team approval, contact Tom Monkus at (727) 821-9080. Boat priority will be given to non-JV teams.

7. FEES & REGISTRATION

The entry fee shall be \$60.00 per school team, paid in advance by using the Regatta [Registration](#) and [Waiver](#) forms available on the SAISA website (www.saisa.org) under “General Forms – [Samples](#)”.

Registrations will be accepted first from Inland Area teams whose registration package is received by Monday, 09/26/11, in the order they are received. Registrations from other areas will then be accepted in order received.

All registrations are to be received by Lisa Chambers no later than Tuesday, 09/27/11.

Once 12 schools have registered, additional schools will be notified that their entry shall be contingent upon their ability to bring their own 420 sailboat in good racing condition to add to the rotation.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available at the competitors meeting at Lake Norman Yacht Club.

9. BOATS

Club 420's will be used. Twelve (12) will be provided by Lake Norman Yacht Club.

10. RACING AREA

Racing will be on Lake Norman near Lake Norman Yacht Club www.lakenormanyachtclub.com/

11. DAMAGE

Damage that requires more than normal maintenance is considered a serious incident. If the Protest Committee determines that reasonable care was not used and resulted in damage, one or both boats may be disqualified, regardless of any alternative penalties already taken. In extreme cases, either or both boats may be excluded from the rest of the regatta and sailors or teams held financially responsible for the damages.

12. LUNCHESES

Up to 5 Saturday lunches will be included in the regatta fee; additional lunches will be \$6 each.

Reservations for all lunches MUST BE MADE with registration.

13. DIRECTIONS

Lake Norman Yacht Club is located north of Charlotte, NC; follow Interstate 77 to Exit 33. Turn west onto Williamson Road. Go approximately 2 miles to first traffic light and turn left onto Brawley School Road. Go 5.0 miles to traffic circle (you will pass through one traffic light along your way). Exit traffic circle on OPPOSITE side as you entered (pretend it was never there). Go 0.9 miles and turn LEFT on Yacht Road. Go 0.8 miles and turn LEFT into LNYC. After entering gate, turn left and follow the drive to the pavilion.

14. CAMPING / HOTELS

LNYC has camping and bathing facilities. No electrical hookups are available. No pets. No camping in club buildings.

16. SPECIAL CLOTHING

While on the rotation dock and on the water, competitors shall wear clothing appropriate for water conditions of 50°F. This can include a dry suit, wet suit or a thermal polyester layer covered by a windproof shell. Cotton clothing including jeans, sweat suits and t-shirts are prohibited.

THE USE OR POSSESSION OF ILLEGAL DRUGS AND/OR ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IS ABSOLUTELY PROHIBITED ON AND OFF THE WATER BY ANY COMPETITOR. ANY COMPETITOR USING, POSSESSING, OR BEING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF SUCH DRUGS OR ALCOHOL WILL BE DISQUALIFIED FROM THE COMPETITION.

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
