NOTICE OF RACE

HOST: Ransom Everglades School

SITE: Anderson Sailing Center (Ransom Waterfront); 3575 Main Highway, Coconut Grove, Miami 33133

1. RULES

This regatta will be governed by the current ISSA Procedural Rules and SAISA Supplementary Rules, *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the prescriptions of US SAILING, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions. Advertising will be restricted to Category A.

2. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Saturday, Jan 22:

0900 Arrival and check-in, boat rigging.
0930 Competitors' meeting
1000 Start of first race of the day

Sunday, Jan 23 (If a rotation can not be completed Saturday)

0900 Competitor's meeting
0945 Start of the first race
1400 No race to be started after this time

3. FORMAT

This will be a two-division regatta; teams will rotate through the boat per a rotation posted on the day of the event. A Sound Signal Starting System shall be used. Competitors should expect numerous short races with boat rotations as set forth at the skipper's meeting. It shall be the goal of the race committee to complete one full round robin rotation of boats. If racing is needed on Sunday, to complete a rotation, teams should be prepared to race on Sunday.

4. SCORING

Low point system for individual races as modified by ISSA Rule 9. Ties will be resolved per procedural rule 11(c). Note that when the school "team" is composed of 2 or more sailors from different schools the composite team sailor's schools will be indicated on the results. Minimally the 1st -3rd divisional & top 3 places will indicate the names of the sailors on the race results. Race highlights with results will be forwarded to SAISA for processing & points will be awarded to qualify for participation in the District Championship & qualifier for the ISSA Mallory Trophy regatta.

Protests hearings, if any, will take place between races. We will attempt to post preliminary results in real time between races.

5. AWARDS

Prizes may be awarded after completion of the last race with results to follow.

6. FEES

The entry fee shall be \$35.00 per each school team, paid in advance by using the [registration](#) and [waiver](#) forms available on the South Atlantic Interscholastic Sailing Assoc. website (www.saisa.org) listed under III. *General Forms: Registration, Waivers, RP Forms - [Samples](#).*

7. ELIGIBILITY

7.1 All current Member school teams of the South Atlantic Interscholastic Sailing Association (SAISA) are welcome. The regatta is a South Points Regatta. Points will also be awarded to qualify for participation in the Mallory District Championship & Qualifier for ISSA fleet racing nationals, within the South Atlantic District. *If a North Point or Caribbean team wishes to participate they may be required to provide their own 420. These teams will be scored in place similar to a JV team. A NP Inland team will receive participation credit.*

7.2 All teams must be members in good standing with SAISA. If a team wishes to participate, and has not yet paid the ISSA/SAISA dues, they will be provided the opportunity to pay dues at check-in.

7.3 Registration is on a first paid/first allowed basis. Once 15 teams have registered, each team after the 15th will be notified by the venue that their entry shall be contingent upon their ability to bring their own 420 sailboat to add to the rotation.

7.4 Competitors must attend the school they represent full time and must be in the 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade, as of the date of the Regatta. If your team does not have sufficient sailors to form the necessary A & B divisions, we will attempt to "mix and match" sailors from different member teams.

A team lacking sufficient skippers to compete in both divisions of a two-divisional point's event may register to sail in either A or B division and will be scored DNS for each race in the division in which they do not field a team. One-division teams will be scored in place, will be eligible for divisional honors, and will receive points according to their over-all place. Teams without skippers may attend point's regattas and may register as 'present'; their sailors may be substituted in crew positions.

7.5 8th grade students attending a feeder school (a lower school zoned to attend a SAISA member high school) may sail in skipper and crew positions, and will be so identified in the results and Record of Participation (RP Form). Any team sailing 8th grade skippers will be scored in place, will be eligible for team and divisional awards, but will receive no more than one-half of a point for their participation in the regatta.

7.6 An adult school representative/advisor is required to accompany each team and be responsible for their conduct on and off the water. The team representative, who may be an advisor, coach, or parent, is expected to have full authority to obtain medical treatment for his team members.

7.7 An eligible SAISA team may enter a varsity and JV team (if the team membership is at 12 or more sailors); however only the varsity team score will be used to determine South Points. A JV team may be entered only when pre-approved by SAISA. For JV team approval, contact Tom Monkus at (727) 821.9080. Depending on boat availability, each JV team may be responsible for providing their own 420 (may or may not be rotated through the fleet). Boat availability will be given to non-JV teams.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available upon check-in.

9. BOATS

Collegiate 420's will be used, and 15 will be provided by the venue. Personal safety equipment including US Coast Guard Type III PFDs must be furnished by the competitors. Bailers will not be provided.

10. RACING AREA

The regatta will be held on Biscayne Bay south and east of the entrance to Dinner Key Channel.

11. LUNCHES

Plan to bring your own lunch and water. A BBQ lunch will be provided by the Ransom Everglades Sailing Booster parents on Saturday after the racing.

12. DAMAGE

Damage that requires more than normal maintenance is considered a serious incident. If the Regatta Chairman determines that reasonable care was not used and resulted in damage one or both boats may be disqualified regardless of any alternative penalties already taken. In extreme cases, either or both boats may be excluded from the rest of the regatta and held financially responsible for the damages.

13. DIRECTIONS

Ransom Everglades Upper School is approximately 20 minutes from Miami International Airport and lies on the waterfront of Coconut Grove just south of Dinner Key.
